

PIP Clarification

To clarify any confusion about PIP hours, the PIP program is posted on our website. You will find it under Parent Information near the bottom of the page. In a nutshell, all families are required to complete 10 hours of service to the school. Single parent households complete 5 hours. Baked goods earn families 1 hour of PIP per event with a minimum of a dozen. 1/2 hour is earned per \$10 spent (receipt attached) per event. You can only earn up to 2 PIP hours per event for donated items. Time in service is calculated hour per hour. At the end of an event you will receive an email confirmation of your item donation or time donation. This needs to be stapled to your PIP form (found on the website). These are due into the office by April 1. Families failing to complete PIP hours will be charged at a rate of \$25 per hour.

Families that participate in sports have an additional 4 service hours per student per sport that must be served through the sports program. Until these additional hours are served for sports, these cannot be applied to the school PIP hours. If a child does not participate in sports, families are welcome to help at sporting events and earn school PIP hours.
