Murky Reef: 1<sup>st</sup> - 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading, Science, Math Cost: \$3.99 (so didn't actually see it...) Looks good, seems to emphasis speed/fluency

Letter Reflex An app that seeks to help students who have trouble with letter reversals db pq. Gives students practice.

Phonics Genius for more than just CCVe (silent e words). Has 200 phonic patterns with option to record student reading words.

K-3 Sight Words five different levels to build the memorization of words that can't always be sounded out

Hungry Monster Build Word a student favorite. Five increasing levels of difficulty (short vowels, long vowels, r-controlled, vowel teams, etc.) A game where student chooses correct phonic pattern to 'match' word that was spoken. They get to feed the hungry monster if they are correct.

Reading for Details This one sounds good. After reading passages, the students are asked who, what, when, where, why questions. Three levels of difficulty

Phonics Tic Tac Toe made by the Lakeshore company. Offers a selection of questions for the student to choose from to complete '3 in a row'.

Word Wizard An app that could be used easily to practice spelling word lists.

Opposites Recommended by Reading Rockets with building levels of difficulty. Has dictionary feature that explains words when needed.

Professor Garfield Fact or Opinion (free!) and Recommended by Reading Rockets for grade levels K-2. An important comprehension skill is taught by a favorite cartoon character.

The Sight Word Adventure Appears to have several games/activities that help student learn the high frequency/sight words that cannot always be 'sounded out'
